Concept Note & Programme

Background

The International Telecommunication Union (ITU) - the United Nations specialized agency for digital technologies - and the UN Futures Lab/Global Hub are partnering to integrate foresight practices and approaches into the development of ITU Strategic Plan 2028-2031. This collaboration comes at a time of profound uncertainty for the multilateral system, shaped by rapid technological change, environmental challenges, political shifts, economic volatility, and evolving social dynamics. It also coincides with ITU's 160th anniversary, making a pivotal moment for reflection and forward-looking thinking.

The UN Secretary-General's 2021 report, *Our Common Agenda*, underscored the need for the UN and multilateral system to be better prepared for major global risks while ensuring that policy decisions consider their impact on future generations. To this end, the <u>UN Futures Lab</u> (per *Our Common Agenda* proposal) was established by the Executive Office of the UN Secretary-General in 2023, to build and leverage strategic foresight efforts across the UN system and beyond to use futures thinking and strategic foresight in planning, policymaking, and decision-making.

Strategic foresight is an approach for systematically thinking and acting in a long-term and anticipatory way under conditions of uncertainty¹. The UN Futures Lab/Global Hub supported 7 multiyear UN Strategic Plans in 2024 and more than 5 in 2025, and will draw on lessons learned and insights to design and facilitate the workshops.

This Concept Note and Programme outlines the objectives, workshops overview, and agendas for two foresight workshops² that will inform the development of ITU's next Strategic Plan.
