Categories of terms and definitions

The CCT Secretariat analyses the terms and definitions received and classifies them in three categories:

Category	Proposed course of action
A Terms and definitions that are clear and conform to the editorial guidelines	<p>These terms and definitions will be included in a document that will be circulated to the members of the CCT one month prior to the meeting for consideration and comments, if any.</p> <p>If no comments are received, the document will be submitted to the next CCT meeting and be proposed for approval without opening it. Those terms and definitions that would have already been published will be validated and submitted for translation.</p>
B Terms and definitions that are clear, but which may require adaptation to the editorial guidelines	<p>These terms and definitions, including any suggested editorial adaptations from the Secretariat, will be included in a document that will be circulated to the members of the CCT one month prior to the meeting for consideration and comments, if any.</p> <p>If no comments are received, the comments from the Secretariat will be forwarded to the respective study groups for their consideration.</p>
C Terms and definitions that require clarification and further discussion	<p>The terms and definitions requiring further analysis will be discussed at the next CCT meeting.</p>
