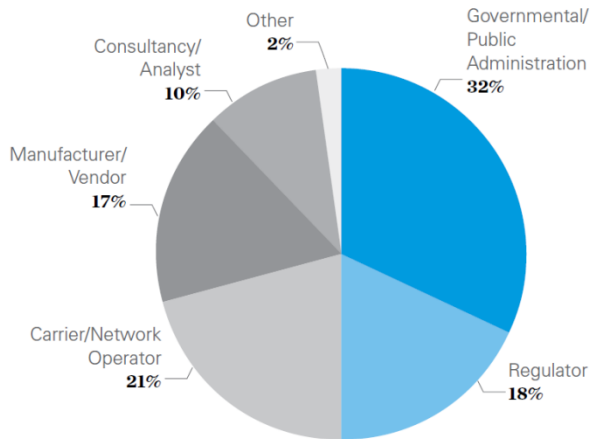

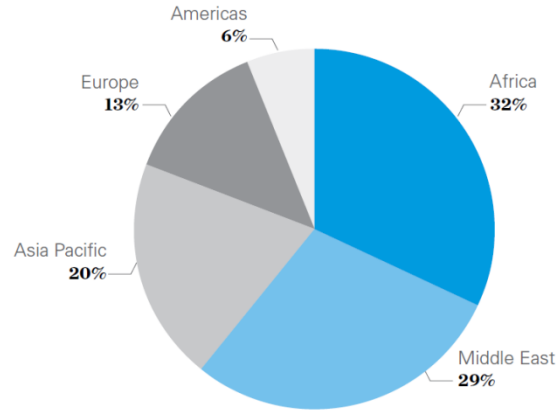

World 2012 demographics



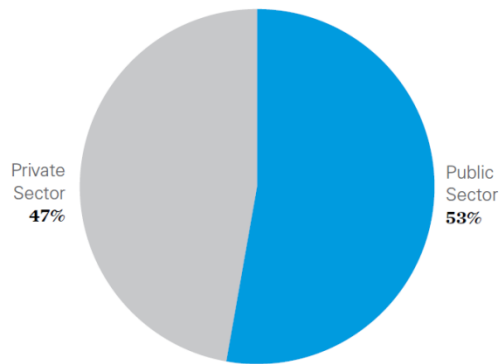
Company type

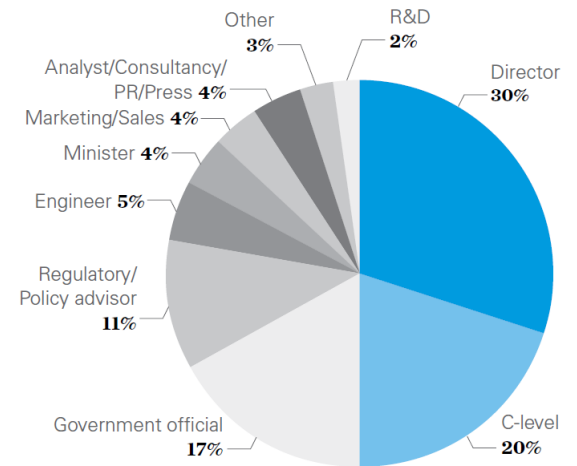

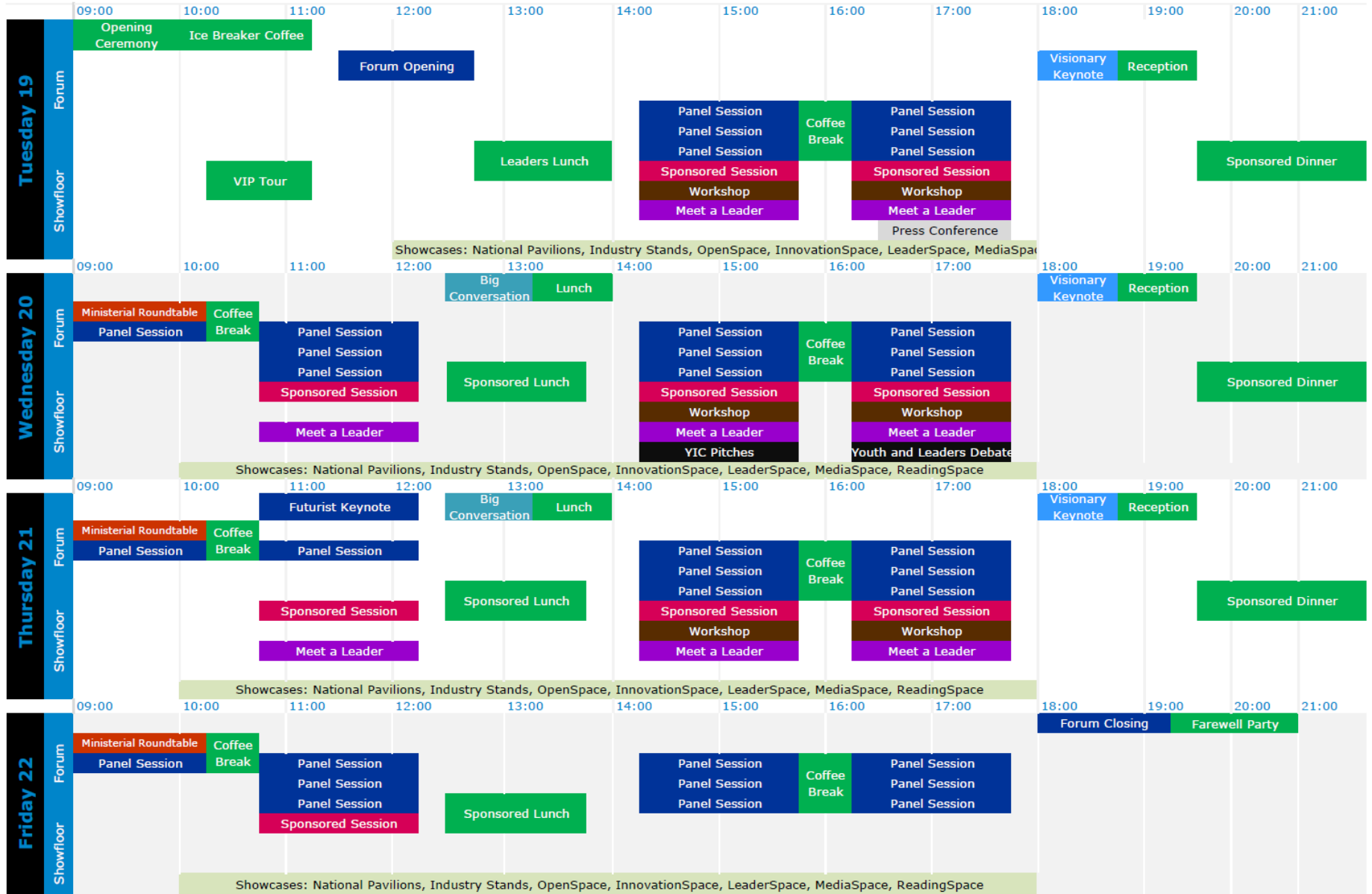

1 x Leader Pass for the MINISTER OF COMMUNICATIONS

1 x Leader Pass for the REGULATOR
1x Gold Pass for accompanying delegate

Members States can purchase additional passes (including Leaders Pass) at 20% discount on prevailing rates

Special passes are available for spouses accompanying Ministers or Regulators

Coordination of Access Passes between Connect ASP and World 2013

Connect ASP and World 2013 will have separate registration processes and badges

Heads of State/Government, ministers, regulators and accompanying delegations attending Connect must register separately for World 2013

Large delegations attending Connect and staying on for World 2013 who exceed their free quota of Gold passes may purchase additional Gold passes with a 20% discount

All Connect pass holders interested in visiting the World 2013 Showfloor, but not attending the Forum, may register for a free Bronze pass onsite upon presentation of their Connect badge
