## Keynote speakers and panellists

Candace Johnson, President, EBAN.



Candace Johnson is a co-founder of SES, the world's pre-eminent satellite group and the architect of SES Global. She is also founding President of Europe Online Investments S.A., the world's first internetbased online service and satellite broadband network, and founder of Loral Cyberstar-Teleport Europe, Europe's first independent private trans-border satellite communications network.

Ms Johnson is also a founding investor and Member of the Board of Kacific, the high-throughput Satellite Internet System for the Pacific. She is founding President of the VATM, the Association of Private Telecom Operators in Germany and founding President of the Global Telecom Women's Network (GTWN). Under her presidency of EBAN, she has co-founded MBAN, the Middle East Business Angel Network and ABAN, the African Business Angel Network. She is also a member of the Advisory Board of numerous European and US ventures as well as being a Member of the Board of Governors of EDHEC (France), the University of Haifa in Israel, Sabanci University in Istanbul Turkey, and a Senior Enterprise Fellow for the University of Essex and its OECD-Leeds Program.

Ms Johnson has been decorated by the Government of Luxembourg with the Commander of Merit and the Officer of the Oak Leaf Crown for her work in founding and building SES to become one of the world's largest satellite systems. She is also an Officer of the German Federal Order of Merit, bestowed on her for her work in privatizing telecommunications and media throughout Germany and Europe. Amongst many other honours, Ms Johnson has received the "Lifetime Achievement Award" together with Vinton Cerf and Tim Berners-Lee from the World Communications Awards for her work in providing universal access to telecommunications around the world.

She holds Masters Degrees with Honours from the Sorbonne and Stanford Universities, a Bachelor's Degree from Vassar College and her high-school degree from Punahou, Honolulu, Hawaii.

Katherine Milligan, Director, Schwab Foundation for Social Entrepreneurship.



Katherine Milligan is the Director and Head of the Schwab Foundation for Social Entrepreneurship. She received her B.A. from Dartmouth College and her Master's in Public Policy from the Kennedy School of Government, where she was the recipient of the Pforzheimer Scholarship for Excellence in Non-profit Management. Katherine's previous work experience includes a Sheldon Knox Research Fellowship at Harvard University (2004-2005); a Global Leadership Fellow of the World Economic Forum (2005-2009). Before that she was a Peace Corps volunteer in West Africa and a strategy consultant for several non-profits. Her work has been published in the International Institute of Economics, Stanford Social Innovation Review, MIT journal Innovations, and the Harvard Business School. Aicha Pouye is Director of the Division of Business and Institutional Support in August 2006. Before joining ITC, she was Minister of Small and Medium-Sized Enterprises and Trade in the Government of Senegal, holding responsibility for trade negotiations, export promotion strategies and assistance strategies for small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs). Ms Pouye also managed Senegal's Millennium Challenge Account with the Millennium Challenge Corporation, an initiative of the U.S. Government to increase economic growth and reduce poverty in Senegal.

The Canary Island Chambers of Commerce and the Conseil National du Patronat du Sénégal (CNP), the largest Senegalese private sector association, awarded her the distinction of Best African Policy Maker supporting private sector development.

Ms Pouye began her career in 1984 as a Junior Auditor with Ernst and Young International. She then joined Citibank Dakar, Senegal, as Manager, Chief Financial Controller in 1990. Her positions with the bank included those of Resident Vice President and Group Vice President, and in 1997, she became Director of Cash Management and International Trade Department. In June 2000, Ms Pouye was appointed General Administrator of the Economic Promotion Fund, an institution put in place by the African Development Bank (AfDB) and the government of Senegal for funding commercial banks to finance Senegalese SMEs.
