- 1. Mainstream youth engagement and participation in the work of ITU to support the achievement of the overall goals of the Union.
- 2. Encourage youth participation in ITU programs, events and activities, as well as engage with them for the decision-making processes.
- 3. Promote ICT youth related ICT policies within ITU Members to ensure inclusiveness and empower youth, particularly in developing countries.
- 4. Engage in regular dialogue and consultations with youth.
- 5. Include a youth perspective in the development and implementation of the ITU strategic plan

Objectives of the Generation Connect Global Youth Summit

- To achieve meaningful youth engagement, consultation, collaboration, empowerment, participation and calls for action, aimed at bringing the voices of young people into the ITU discussions and activities;
- To attain open and frank discussions, where youth can share what is good about technology, and what worries them. By fully engaging youth from the design and content to the format of the Summit, ITU will get a truly meaningful youth roadmap for the future;
- To encourage the participation of young women, young people with disabilities and young indigenous people. The Summit hopes to also include the voices of young people that are not connected and are currently not being empowered through technology;
- To implement, through the organization of the Youth Summit, the ITU Youth Strategy, which was adopted by ITU Members during TDAG-20;
- To be aligned with the vision and objectives of the United Nations Youth Strategy: Youth 2030 working with and for young people.



Generation Connect Global Youth Summit

2-4 June 2022, Kigali, Rwanda



Target

Target youth engagement and participation of over 400 young attendees (ages 18-29), with a diverse range of at least two or more youth individuals per country to participate in the Summit.

Virtual participation open to youth aged 15-29.

Why

Youth representatives will build new digital skills, debate and network with global decision makers of the ICT sector including politicians, business leaders and make an impact on a global stage.

Where

Held in a hybrid format, with physical participation along with virtual youth engagement, preceding the WTDC

Result

"Call to Action" document to be submitted to world leaders at WTDC.

Participation in the Summit, will encourage participants to go back to their countries, organizations and communities and redouble their efforts as global digital change makers

ENGAGE

Involving young people in decision-making processes. Youth play an integral role in digital accessibility and policy making for a digital future. Topics in this stream of the Summit will include digital inequalities, sustainability, and the role of youth in policy making.

EMPOWER

Providing resources for young people in the workforce, including youth entrepreneurs, to enhance their digital skills. Offering guidance and equal opportunities for young people is essential in bridging the digital divide. This stream will cover topics such as bridging the gender digital divide, entrepreneurship, mentorship and the future of work

PROTECT

Fostering the safety and wellbeing of young people using digital technologies. With digital advancement comes the responsibility to prevent online risks and use technologies efficiently. Topics for discussion will include the role of ICTs in mitigating climate change, online safety, cybersecurity and maintaining mental health and avoid digital dependencies.
