Registration Process

Create an ITU user account (if you don't already have one):

- 3. You will receive an acknowledgment email after submission.

2.Approval:

- 1. Your application will be reviewed by the designated ITU-D Coordinators.
- 2. Once approved, you will receive a confirmation email.

Medical Services

Health Management Post: Located at the Regional Base in Matanzas, operational to coordinate any situation during the event.

Provincial Coordination Center: Active 24/7 during the event days to ensure emergency coordination. **Emergency Numbers:**

•Quick-dial emergency number: 104.

- •Landline available: (45) 288400.
- These numbers will be accessible to support personnel.

Hotel Medical Office:

•Operational 24/7 with a doctor and nurse on site.

•Equipped with necessary medications and resources to handle medical consultations and nonemergency conditions.

Emergency Medical Care:

•Advanced Life Support Ambulance (call sign 233), available with an experienced doctor, nurse, and paramedic.

•Equipped with tools and medications for initial care of critical patients.

•Capable of transporting patients to primary or secondary intensive care facilities as required.

Medical Services

Flow for National Patients:

•They will be transferred to the Municipal Intensive Care Area at the Ramón Martínez Polyclinic in Varadero.

•If prolonged care is needed, they will be taken to the Provincial Hospital Comandante Faustino Pérez, where the required service will be evaluated and determined.

Flow for Foreign Patients:

•They will first be transferred to the International Clinic of Varadero for case reevaluation. •If prolonged care is needed:

- They will be transferred to the AMI Ward at the Provincial Hospital Faustino Pérez or the Intensive Care Unit, depending on the complexity of the case.
- Patients under 19 years old will be transferred to the AMI Ward at the Eliseo Noel Camaño Pediatric Hospital in Matanzas.

•If tertiary care is required, they will be transported via Advanced Life Support Ambulance (AVA) to the Cira García Hospital in Havana.

Travel Time Estimates for Transfers

•From Hotel Meliá Internacional to the International Clinic:

Distance: 4 kilometers Travel Time: 3 minutes

•From Hotel Meliá Internacional to the Municipal Intensive Care Area at the Ramón Martínez Polyclinic: Distance: 10 kilometers Travel Time: 5 minutes

•From Hotel Meliá Internacional to the International Medical Care Ward and Intensive Care Unit: Distance: 50 kilometers Travel Time: 30 minutes

Currency in Circulation in Cuba

•National Currency: Cuban Peso (CUP) 1 CUP = 100 cents.

•Banknotes in circulation:

• Denominations :1, 3, 5, 10, 20, 50, 100, 200, 500 and 1000 pesos.

•Coins in circulation:

- Fractions: 1, 3, and 5 pesos
- Centavos: 5 and 20.

Currency Exchange

- Locations for exchanging foreign currency to CUP: Airports, Banks, Hotels, Exchange bureaus (CADECA).
- Exchange rate: Based on global market fluctuations.

Entry of Foreign Currency

•Currencies accepted for exchange to CUP:

- US Dollar.
- Canadian Dollar.
- Euro.
- Swiss Franc.
- British Pound.
- Japanese Yen.
- Mexican Peso.

•Important Note:

- The Cuban Peso (CUP) is neither valid nor exchangeable outside of Cuba.
- Before departing, any remaining CUP must be exchanged.

Payments in Cuba

•Purchases and service payments:

• Can be made using MLC (Freely Convertible Currency) Prepaid Cards.

Acquiring Prepaid Cards

Where to obtain them: CADECA offices, airports, hotels, and ports.

Use of Cards

Valid for payments in:

•Goods and services in the commercial network.

- •Hotel reservations.
- •Excursions.
- •Shopping in stores.
- •Purchasing airline tickets.
- •Car rentals.
- •Services in restaurants and cafeterias.

Balance Refund

How and Where:

Upon the client's request, the balance is refunded in Freely Convertible Currency (MLC).
Available at Exchange Bureaus (CADECA) in international airports.
Refunds are provided in any foreign currency accepted by the country.

•Visa, Mastercard, Union Pay, Ocean Card, CABAL, American International Service (AIS) **Restriction:**

•Cards issued by institutions in the United States do not work in Cuba.
