# Subject: Regional Development Forum (RDF-ASP), 19 March 2025, and Regional Preparatory Meeting for Asia and the Pacific (RPM-ASP) 20-21 March 2025, Bangkok, Thailand

Dear Sir/Madam,

I am pleased to invite you to participate in the Regional Preparatory Meeting for Asia and the Pacific (RPM-ASP), to be held from 20-21 March 2025, in preparation for the World Telecommunication Development Conference (WTDC-25) which will take place in Baku, Azerbaijan from 17 to 28 November 2025 at the kind invitation of the Government of Azerbaijan.

The RPM-ASP will be preceded by the Regional Development Forum for Asia and the Pacific (RDF-ASP) at the same venue, on 19 March 2025.

In line with Resolution 31 (Rev. Kigali, 2022), the Regional Preparatory Meeting aims at engaging the Membership in the WTDC-25 process in order to achieve regional coordination before the Conference. It also seeks to identify issues at the regional level, that need to be addressed to foster the development of telecommunications/ICTs, taking into account the most pressing needs faced by the Member States and Sector Members of the region.

RPM-ASP will provide a platform for identifying priority areas which are essential for the telecommunication/ICT development of the countries of the region. To this end, and to facilitate effective preparations by the ITU Membership, a draft RPM-ASP agenda has been prepared and can be found in **Annex 1**.

Members participating in this RPM meeting will also be able to review and provide input on the preliminary draft ITU-D contribution to the ITU Strategic Plan for 2028-2031, the preliminary draft ITU-D Action Plan 2026-2030, and the preliminary draft WTDC-25 Declaration ahead of WTDC-25. These documents, which will be available on the <u>RPM-ASP website</u>, are intended to assist in the written formulation of the issues and priorities for each of the regions.

On 19 March 2025, the RDF-ASP will provide an opportunity for high-level dialogue, cooperation and partnerships among telecommunication/ICT policy makers, regulators, industry, academia, regional and international development agencies and organizations on specific regional telecommunication/ICT issues. RDFs serve as a platform for assessing strategic orientations that may have an impact on the regional work plan of the Telecommunication Development Bureau (BDT) in between world telecommunication development conferences. A draft RDF-ASP agenda has been prepared and can be found in **Annex 2**.

**Annex 3** to this letter provides detailed information about key deadlines for submission of contributions, for registration and remote participation, for fellowships and for all the basic information to allow you to participate and make the best of these two events. Practical information will be posted on the event website in due course.

#### Venue

- <u>Create an ITU user account</u> (if you already have an account, go to step 2): When creating an ITU user account affiliated to an ITU Member (<u>Member States</u>, <u>Sector Members</u>, <u>Associates</u>, <u>Academia</u>, and UN System), users must obtain approval of their affiliation from the corresponding TIES Focal Point prior to submitting a registration request.
- <u>Register here</u>: Log in with your ITU user account credentials and complete the corresponding registration request form. After successful submission, you will receive an acknowledgement of successful submission of the registration request.
- 3. Your registration request is automatically forwarded to the corresponding <u>Designated Focal Points</u> (<u>DFPs</u>) for ITU-D event registration.
- 4. Upon the approval of the DFP, you will receive a confirmation of registration email.

### **Fellowships**

The decision criteria to grant a fellowship include:

- available ITU budget;
- equitable distribution among countries and regions;
- gender balance and the inclusion of persons with disabilities and persons with specific needs.

Subject to availability of funds, one full fellowship or two partial fellowships may be awarded per eligible Member State of the [region] region.

To request a fellowship, the participant must **first** <u>register to the meeting(s)</u> and obtain focal point **approval.** Any application received after this deadline will not be considered.
