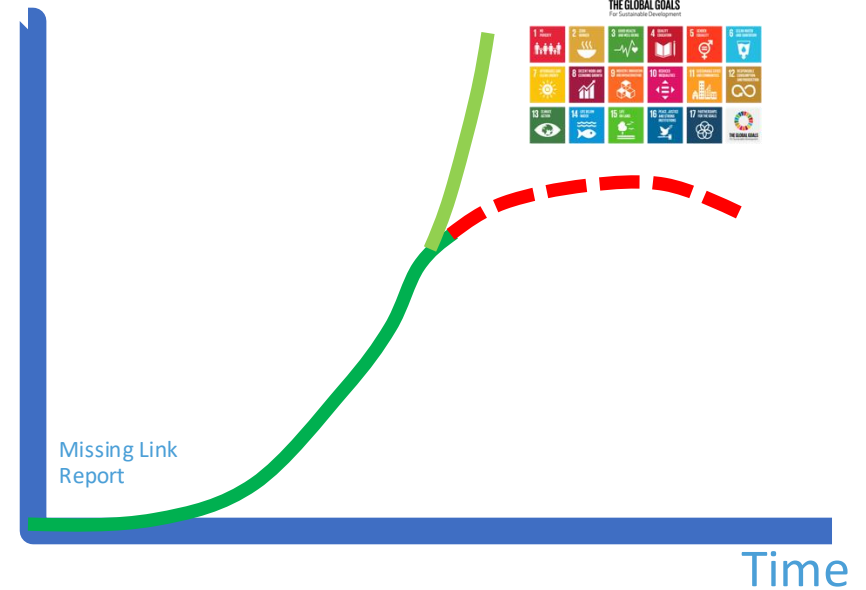
Network of Acceleration Centres

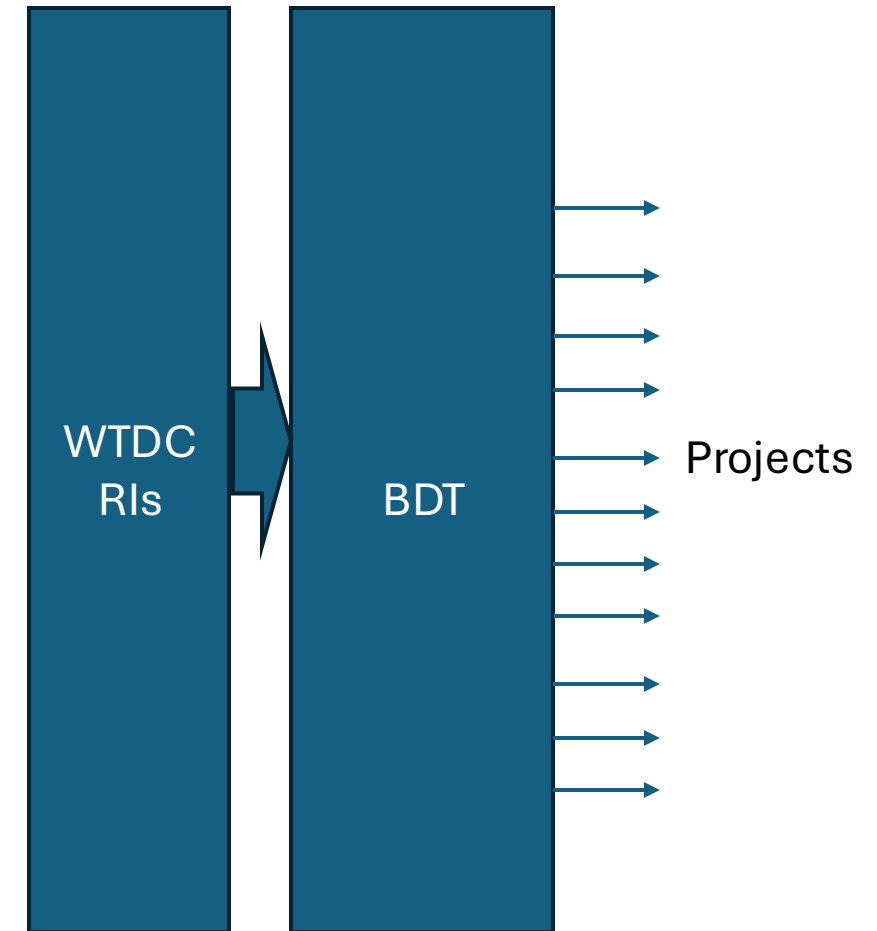
Resolution 17: Implementation of and cooperation on approved regional initiatives at the national, regional, interregional and global levels.

Regional Initiatives are expected to be delivered through projects. The opportunity is to catalyze project activation through a systemic approach.



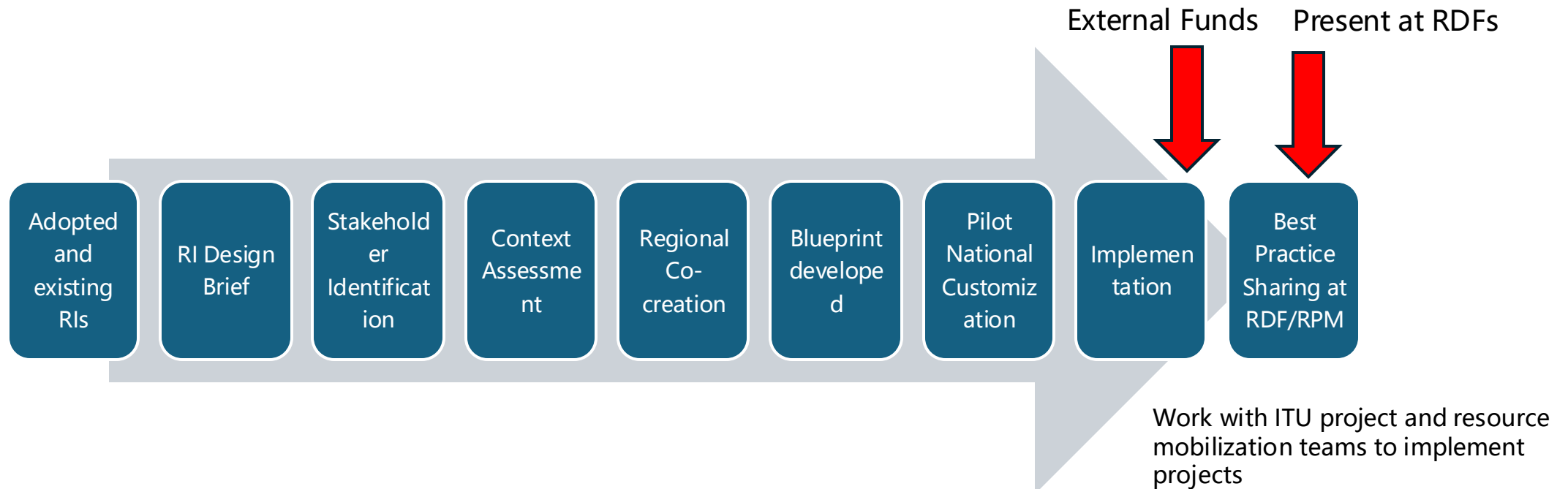
What is the RI Accelerator?

- A mechanism using innovative processes, tools, and frameworks established as a product of the Digital Transformation Lab (one of the Vehicles of the Alliance) to pave the way for a new way the BDT can support delivery of regional initiatives
- A process for accelerating regional initiatives by:
 - kick-starting ideation and definition of RIs and project concepts based on stakeholder engagement
 - supporting the definition and implementation critical milestones of ITU Regional Initiatives

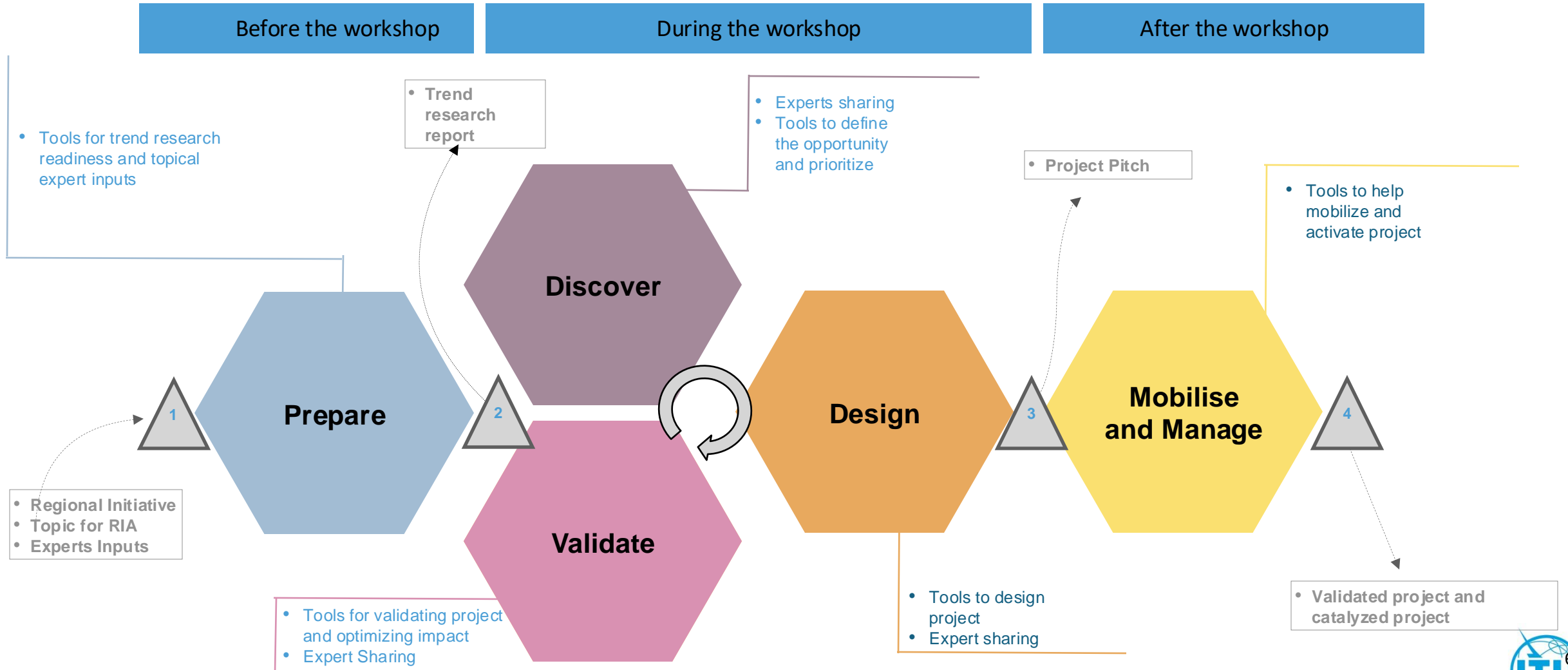


How does it work?

The RI Accelerator is an open platform curated by BDT for interested stakeholders to come together and co-create project concepts based on stakeholder engagement related to ITU Regional Initiatives they would like to accelerate using innovative capabilities and resources.

Our Assumptions for the RI Experimentation

- ☒ 1. **Navigating a changing environment** – Stakeholders can understand the changing context and design projects that are fit for the future.
- ☒ 2. **Projects as expected outcome** – The RIA can catalyze the development of projects from any regional initiative.
- ☒ 3. **Clarifying expected results** – The RIA can articulate clearer outcomes to achieve each RI.
- ☒ 4. **Defining measurable KPIs** – The RIA can help establish clear metrics to assess progress and impact.
- ☒ 5. **Case studies and knowledge sharing** – The RIA can foster best practice sharing to inform project development.
- ☒ 6. **Engaging stakeholders** – The RIA can identify and engage core stakeholders to drive, interest and ownership of projects.
- ☒ 7. **Capacity building** – The RIA can deliver useful innovation capacity building to stakeholders during the co-design workshops.
- ☐ 8. **Support of ITU acceleration centres**– BDT can drive interest of the Alliance Acceleration centres to support stakeholders develop projects within their agreed scope, amplifying impact through multi-regional projects.
- ☐ 9. **Networking and immersion:** Stakeholders can benefit from an ecosystem immersion and networking opportunities with key experts, partners and seeing specific example to inform their project design or gain access to resources.
- ☐ 10. **Project Activation** – The RIA can support stakeholders with their project activation. The RIA can kick start an interest group of like-minded stakeholders to advocate, provide support and deliver impact.
