I am pleased to invite you to participate in the **Regional Development Forum for Africa 2026 (RDF-AFR)**, to be organized by the International Telecommunication Union (ITU) and hosted by the Postal and Telecommunications Regulatory Authority of Zimbabwe (POTRAZ). The Forum will be held from 25 to 26 May 2026 in **Victoria Falls, Zimbabwe**, back-to-back with the **2nd Africa Preparatory Meeting (APM) for the 2026 ITU Plenipotentiary Conference (PP-26)**, held from 27 to 29 May 2026.

Under the theme '**Universal, meaningful, and affordable connectivity for an inclusive and sustainable digital future**', the Regional Development Forum for Africa serves as a platform for ITU and its stakeholders, including Member States, Sector Members, Associates and Academia, regional organizations, development partners and financial institutions, to discuss the newly adopted regional initiatives for Africa and exchange views on achieving meaningful connectivity and sustainable digital transformation in the region. In this context, the Regional Office for Africa is launching a Regional Consultation that offers ITU Member States, Sector Members, and other stakeholders an opportunity to contribute to ITU's activities at the regional level and to reflect the strategic needs of the region during the implementation of Baku Action Plan for the period 2026 – 2029.

The outcomes of the discussions of the RDF-AFR will be consolidated into an indicative implementation plan for 2026-2029 for the ITU Regional Initiatives for Africa and will be used as the basis for further coordination of the implementation of Regional Initiatives for Africa.
