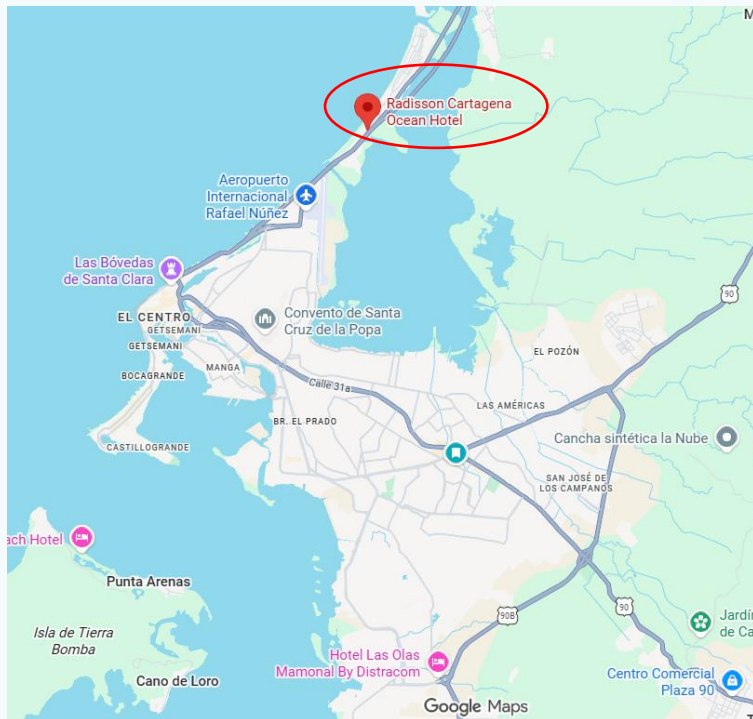


Where and When

PASSPORTS AND VISAS

- All travelers entering **Colombia** must hold a **valid passport**.
- It is recommended that the passport have a **minimum validity of six (6) months** at the time of travel.
- Citizens of many countries **do not require a visa** for short stays (up to **90 days**, extendable), depending on nationality.
- Nationals of some countries **must obtain a visa in advance**.
- Travelers may be required to complete the **Check-Mig form of Migration Colombia** prior to travel.
- All delegations are advised to **verify specific entry requirements** with the Colombian embassy or consulate in their country of origin.

PASSPORTS AND VISAS

Health requirements:

Participants are advised to verify the health requirements for entry into **Colombia** through the official channels of the **Ministry of Health and Social Protection**, according to their country of origin.

Visa support:

The **Comisión de Regulación de Comunicaciones (CRC)** will provide informational support to delegates who request it regarding visa application procedures for entry into Colombia. Any related costs must be covered by the delegates.

Transport and access

Airport Transfers

Rafael Núñez International Airport (CTG):

Located approximately **5–7 km** from the hotel area and Cartagena's historic city center.

Estimated travel time:

15–30 minutes, depending on traffic.

Transportation options from the airport:

- **Official taxis:** available 24/7. Cash payments only.
- **Ride-hailing apps (Uber, Cabify):** operate in the city.
- **Private transfers:** offered by hotels and local transport providers.

Local Transportation in Cartagena

- Taxis available throughout the city.
- Ride-hailing apps: **Uber**, **Cabify**.
- Private transfers arranged by hotels.

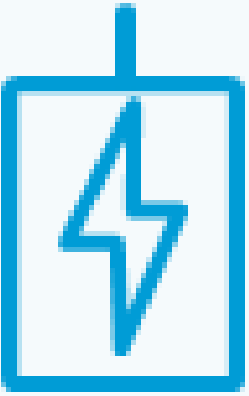
Note: It is recommended to agree on fares in advance or use authorized transport services.

Travel Tips:

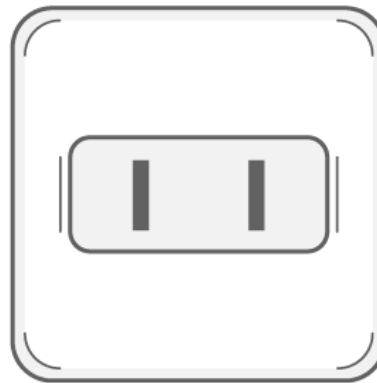
- Carry cash in Colombian pesos (COP) for small expenses, as taxis usually accept cash only, and having local currency will make transportation and other minor purchases easier and more efficient.
- Consider possible traffic congestion during peak hours
- Use authorized transportation services for safety and convenience
- Protect yourself from the heat and stay properly hydrated the city's average temperature



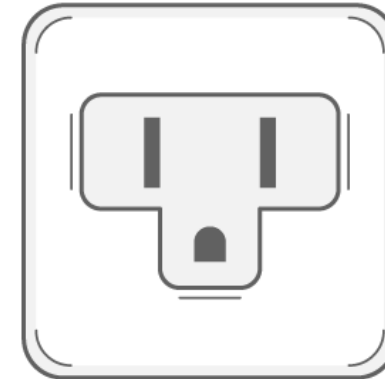
Electricity

General safety recommendations
