# ITU-InfoDev ICT Regulation Toolkit

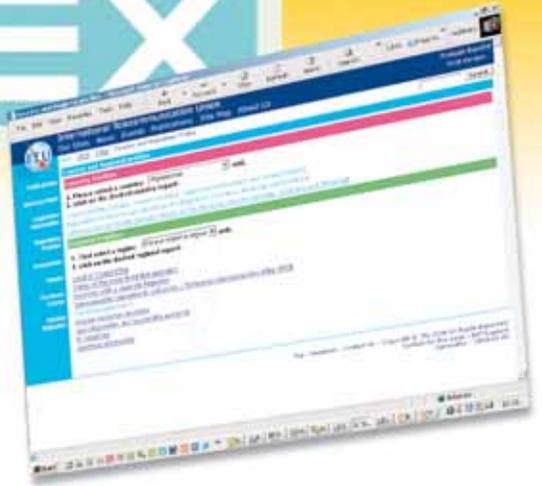
ITU and InfoDev launched a joint initiative to create an evolving online resource designed to address complex regulatory challenges emerging from a rapidly evolving ICT industry.
