## ★ **Manual for Use by Maritime Mobile and Maritime Mobile-Satellite Services – 2005**

This new edition of the *Manual for Use by the Maritime Mobile and Maritime Mobile-Satellite Services* reflects the regulatory provisions and the latest decisions concerning those services by ITU conferences (including relevant decisions pertaining to the introduction of new systems and techniques). As prescribed in Appendix 16 of the Radio Regulations, the manual is required to be carried by stations on board ships.

## ★ **List IV – List of Coast Stations – 19th edition 2004\***

This List contains particulars of coast stations and coast earth stations providing a public correspondence service with their charges and accounting authorities. The List also contains an annex with particulars on different categories of stations participating in the Global Maritime Distress and Safety System (GMDSS) (e.g. particulars of stations transmitting maritime safety information that participate in the NAVTEX services coordinated by the International Maritime Organization). In pursuance of Article 20 of the Radio Regulations, this service publication is published every two years and is kept up to date by means of three semi-annual supplements. As prescribed in Appendix 16 to the Radio Regulations, this List is required to be carried in stations on board ships for which a radiotelegraph installation is required by international agreement. It is also required to be carried in stations on board ships for which a radiotelephone is required by international agreement, and in stations on board ships for which a GMDSS installation is required by international agreement, unless these stations are sailing only within range of VHF coast stations.

## ★ **List V – List of Ship Stations – 45th edition 2005\***

This List is published in two parts as follows: *Part A (paper publication)*: This part contains particulars of those ship stations for which an MMSI number has been notified to the Radiocommunication Bureau, with the exception of pleasure ships (general classification PL). It also contains details of Accounting Authorities and countries responsible for notifications. *Part B (CD-ROM publication)*: This part contains particulars of all ship stations notified to the Bureau, with or without a Maritime Mobile Service Identity (MMSI) number as well as all the information contained in Part A. This is presented in Acrobat PDF format. It also contains a copy of all ship stations in a database format along with an interface, similar to the ITU MARS system ([www.itu.int/ITU-R/terrestrial/mars/index.asp](http://www.itu.int/ITU-R/terrestrial/mars/index.asp)), which enables users to search for and display particulars and details of ship stations, accounting authorities and countries responsible for the notifications. As prescribed in Appendix 16 to the Radio Regulations, all stations on board ships for which a GMDSS or Morse radiotelegraph installation is required by international agreement shall be provided with this List. This List is kept up to date by means of a supplement (September 2005), followed by a recapitulative supplement (December 2005).

## ★ **List VI – List of Radiodetermination and Special Service Stations – 16th edition 2006**

This List contains particulars of radio direction-finding stations and radiobeacon stations of the maritime radionavigation service and the particulars of radiodetermination-satellite systems available for maritime use, ocean-station vessels, direction-finder calibration stations as well as stations transmitting standard frequency and time signals, regular meteorological bulletins, notices to navigators, medical advice and ursigrams. In pursuance of Article 20 of the Radio Regulations, this service publication is published by ITU at intervals decided by the Secretary-General, normally about every three and a half years, and is kept up to date by supplements issued every six months. As prescribed in Appendix 16 to the aforementioned Regulations, this List is required to be carried in stations on board ships for which a radiotelegraph installation is required by international agreement.

## ★ **List VII A – List of Call Signs and Numerical Identities of Stations Used by the Maritime Mobile and Maritime Mobile-Satellite Services – 22nd edition 2005**

This List contains allocation tables: international call sign series (Appendix 42 of the Radio Regulations), blocks of coast station identification numbers, blocks of selective call numbers for ship stations and selective call numbers for groups of ship stations, and Maritime Identification Digits (MIDs). It also contains a list of signals characterizing the emissions of radiobeacon stations as well as a list of call signs used in the maritime mobile service and a list of numerical identities used in the maritime mobile and maritime mobile-satellite services (maritime mobile service identities (MMSI), coast station identification numbers, ship station selective call numbers and Inmarsat communications system numbers). In addition, it also lists call signs and numerical identities assigned to predetermined groups of stations and a list of former and present call signs of ship stations. *Note*: Ship stations and ship earth stations contained in the List are those for which an MMSI number has been notified and published in the List of Ship Stations (with the exception of pleasure ships – general classification PL). As prescribed in Appendix 16 to the Radio Regulations, all stations on board ships for which a GMDSS installation or a Morse radiotelegraph installation is required by international agreement shall be provided with this List. The List is kept up to date by supplements issued every three months.

## ★ **Maritime Mobile Access and Retrieval System (MARS) – free of charge**

Available on a 24-hour per day and 7-day per week basis on ITU's website ([www.itu.int/ITU-R/terrestrial/mars/index.asp](http://www.itu.int/ITU-R/terrestrial/mars/index.asp)), this system has been developed by ITU with the purpose of providing the maritime community, in particular those entities that are involved in search and rescue activities, with the most up-to-date data registered in the master ITU ship station database. It is possible to: **retrieve** data on particulars of Ship stations – ship (vessel) name, call sign, maritime mobile service identity (MMSI) number, AAIC, etc., as notified by administrations, in accordance with the Radio Regulations; **download** the ship stations file (restricted access) – the purpose of this service is to enable administrations to download a file containing all ship stations that have been notified to ITU; **retrieve** data on particulars of accounting authority identification codes (AAIC) – names, addresses and contact information concerning all registered accounting authorities; **access** particulars of administrations and geographical areas – name, address and contact information of the entities that are responsible for notifying ship station data to ITU as well as the present status of allocations (call sign series, maritime identification digits (MIDs), etc.); and **obtain** particulars of coast stations providing a public correspondence service.
