The Space Radiocommunications Stations on CD-ROM is a service publication issued in electronic format by the Radiocommunication Bureau (BR) pursuant to the pertinent provisions of Article 20 of the Radio Regulations. It contains alphanumeric and graphical information on satellite networks and earth stations, which are provided to and maintained by BR.

The software (**SpaceQry**) allows the user to access the data (in an MS-Access Version 97 database) by such criteria as space station/earth station name, orbital position (or range of orbital positions), space station/earth station administration, country, geographical coordinates, class of station, assigned frequency (or range of assigned frequencies) and category (coordination/notification). It permits the user to navigate within the set of data retrieved, to print some or all of the data and to export an extracted subset to an MS-Access database. The related graphical data (consisting of diagrams for the antenna gain contours, service area and the gain towards the geostationary orbit) can be viewed through **GIMS**, either through the alphanumeric information retrieval software or independently.

The CD-ROM also contains software developed by BR for the electronic notification and validation of satellite networks/earth stations: **SpaceCap** allows the capture of satellite networks/earth stations parameters which can be validated via the **SpaceVal** software; **SpacePub** allows for the printing of satellite networks and earth stations; **GIMS** allows the capture of the related graphical data (mentioned above) and the carrying out of power-flux density calculations; **SPS** is used to analyse the Space Plans (Appendices 30, 30A and 30B); **GIBC** to carry out Appendix 8 (29) and power-flux density calculations; **SpaceCom** for assisting administrations commenting on CR/C Special Sections; and software (R1448) to determine the coordination area around an earth station according to **Appendix 7** (28).

■ Methods of payment

■ Forms of dispatch
