The Thuraya Satellite Telecommunication System

A regional mobile satellite system to the benefit of developing countries.

INTRODUCTION

Telecommunication infrastructure development has been a priority issue among developing countries. The need to extend universal telecommunication access to users in remote areas has been emerging whereby extension of mobile and fixed services in these areas have been facing economical difficulties.

Thuraya mobile satellite system is determined to address these issues and will play an important role in complimenting the existing terrestrial telecommunication infrastructure for their satisfactory resolution.

THURAYA'S CONCEPT

Thuraya is a Geo-mobile satellite system which is under construction planned to offer mobile voice services through dual mode user terminal (GSM-Satellite). Additionally, fax and data at 9.6 KBs/second will be offered to Thuraya users.

Thuraya coverage area include Indian sub-continent, Central Asia, middle East, Eastern Europe and North & Central Africa.

Thuraya's concept is based on complementing existing terrestrial services and not to compete with them.

THE "THURAYA" COMPANY

Thuraya Satellite Telecommunication Company is a private joint venture company established in the United Arab Emirates. Its purpose is to extend mobile satellite services in remote areas not covered by existing terrestrial networks."
