Accomplishments as Director of BDT

Mr Touré took office in February 1999 bringing to the position of Director of the BDT multi-cultural as well as public and private sector experience. Upon taking office, he addressed as a top priority his election commitment to increase transparency and improve management practices within the Bureau. During his first year in office, he restructured the Bureau to adapt to the changing telecommunication environment and to respond to the decisions of the 1998 WTDC, he instituted an annual operational planning system to facilitate management, to decentralize tasks, and to tighten Bureau accountability. He continues to strive to improve productivity and gain maximum benefit from existing resources.



Since taking office, Mr Touré has progressively improved communication with Sector Members, forged Private Sector-ITU partnerships and increased Sector membership from 185 in February 1999 to 247 today. He has also strengthened the Regional Presence of ITU, improving its visibility, responsibility and accountability. Mr Touré includes among his highest priorities sector reform, rural communication and capacity building.

Mr Touré opened up participation in TDAG, using the opportunity to improve the relationship between the ITU and Financial institutions, Regulatory Agencies and Training Institutions as well as Regional and International Organizations dealing with Telecommunications.

Under his leadership the Bureau launched the highly successful Global Symposium for Regulators and an online exchange for all regulatory and policy-makers. The purpose of this initiative is to provide a venue for the exchange of information, and to allow regulatory agencies to assist each other in their daily challenges.

Mr Touré has also made the implementation of Resolution 7 of WTDC-98 relating to Gender Issues a top priority, integrating a gender perspective into all the programs of the bureau.

His skill of adapting the BDT to the changing environment is demonstrated by a number of success stories such as his fast reaction to implement opinion D of the policy forum on IP Telephony.

Result orientated, practical in his actions, a team player who has managed to keep the focus on development bringing together the developing and developed countries. Mr. Touré is a natural optimist in spirit, yet a realist in his actions.
