Mr. Klyucharev graduated in 1993 as radio engineer (Honours Diploma). Since that time he has been working in the field of telecommunications occupying different positions in private companies and government organizations. Now he is Deputy Head of International Division in General Radio Frequency Centre (Russia) and is responsible for assisting the Russian Administration in preparatory work for the World/Regional Radiocommunication Conferences and Assemblies on technical and regulatory matters.

He has experience in different sharing/compatibility studies concerning the use of the radio frequency spectrum by terrestrial and space services (GSO and non-GSO orbits), including the test field measurements.

Since 1996, as an expert of the Russian delegation, he participated in a number of meetings for coordination of frequency assignments to satellite and terrestrial networks/stations.
