# ITU-D SGs focus on hot topics of practical importance for development of ICTs

The seventh World Telecommunication Development Conference (WTDC-17) considered the latest trends in telecommunication/information and communication technology (ICT) development and established the priorities of the ITU Telecommunication Development Sector (ITU-D) for the interval between two WTDCs.

WTDC-17 (Resolution 2) established **2 Study Groups** in ITU Development Sector and assigned **7 hot topics (Questions)** to each Study Group. The assigned topics have **practical importance** for the development of ICTs, and ITU membership expects **timely**, **in-depth**, **concise**, **focused**, and **forward-looking reports**.



ITU-D study groups provide an opportunity for the membership to share experiences, present ideas, exchange views, and achieve consensus on strategies to address telecommunication/ICT priorities.

#### **Key deliverables:**

Reports, Guidelines and annual thematic Papers (annual deliverables) based on inputs through contributions, case studies and surveys, which are made available to the membership through online platforms in all UN languages.

#### **Main services:**

- Information exchange (contribution-driven and multi-stakeholder for members by members);
- Capacity building mechanism (thematic expert meetings and workshops online, in headquarters and in the regions);
- Knowledge platform (repository of case studies, lessons learned, best practices and reports)
- **Expert exchange** (engaging communities of experts on thematics of interest for implementation and for facilitating partnerships and collaboration).

The ITU-D study groups work under the leadership of appointed chairmen, vice-chairmen(from regions), rapporteurs and vice-rapporteurs (from regions), and are supported by BDT HQ and Regional focal points and the Study Group Secretariat.

# **Future Appointments**

#### **For Chairs and Vice Chairs**

**PP Resolution 208 (Dubai, 2018), Resolves 4:** "that the term of office for both chairmen and vice-chairmen should not exceed two terms of office between consecutive assemblies or conferences"

- SG Chair/Vice-Chairs ending their second-term: 1 AFR, 2 AMS, 1 ARB, 4 ASP, 1 CIS, 1 EUR
- Additions compared to Resolves in WTDC Res. 61 (rev. Dubai, 2014):
  - (Resolves further 2) increase from two to three candidates per region
  - (Resolves further 3) encourage candidates from countries without current chairmanship or vice-chairmanship
  - (Resolves further 4) max. 1 vice-chair position in 1 Sector, only in exceptional cases in more than 1 Sector
  - (Resolves further 5) respect equitable geographical distribution and promote developing countries
  - (Invites Member States and Sector Members 2) promote the nomination of women candidates

[Tariffs] Special mobile communications tariffs in the Russian Federation for categories of the population entitled to preferential treatment  $(\frac{1}{318})$ : Special mobile communications tariffs for categories of the population entitled to preferential treatment

[Infrastructure] ICT infrastructure co-deployment with road transport and electricity infrastructure ( $\frac{1}{275}$ ): National studies on ICT infrastructure co-deployment with road transport and electricity infrastructure

[Accessibility] Access to television and video content for persons with sight impairments (SG1RGQ/203): Best practices in providing accessible television and video content for persons with sight impairments

[E-health] Guidelines on the construction of telemedicine networks at the local (individual settlements), regional (districts, regions) and national levels (2/203): Guidelines prepared as part of the regional initiative for the CIS countries: "Development of e-health to ensure healthy lives and promote well-being for all, at all ages"

**[E-health] Telemedicine Act** (2/265): Information on best practices in the field of telemedicine, in particular the adoption of the Telemedicine Act, along with concrete examples of how telemedicine is evolving in Russia.

[Child Online Protection] Protecting children from information harmful to their health and development ( $\frac{1}{318}$ ): Best practices with regard to the protection of children from information that is harmful to their health and development


[Smart cities] Creating smart cities and intelligent transport systems ( $\frac{2}{266}$ ): Explores the concept of ITS and its key components and also provides specific examples of ITS implementation in the country.
