CHALLENGES

A. The rise of everyware

- ... removes from the State the information "monopoly"
- ... and changes the nature of the relationships with the State: from a hierarchical structure to a network

Governments as public-service centers that are evaluated on their abilities to deliver through the most efficient and individualized channels.

B. Commitment to inclusiveness

- ... challenges to the way governance is conceptualized.
- EGOV as an instrument for sustainable development
 Example: e-platforms for land registration and management

MEASURING: INSTRUMENTS AND CHALLENGES

Measuring: achievements, weaknesses, challenges

Evaluation Dimensions

- Transformational effects
- Infrastructure investments
- Political and sociological effects
- Economic and sustainability impacts

RE-THINKING EGOV EVALUATION

- From benchmarking to benchlearning: focus on impact (uniformity is not inclusive)
- Impact on sustainable development (example: e-procurement platforms)
- Back to basics: Data! (diversification of sources; big data; data from the demand-side)
- Partnerships for EGOV evaluation: a multi-stakeholder exercise (research institutions; private sector; citizens)
