




# WSIS Action Lines – Sustainable Development Goals Impact of WSIS Action Lines on Sustainable Development Goals





The WSIS implementation mechanism at the international level is organised taking into account the themes and action lines in the Geneva Plan of Action, and moderated or facilitated by UN agencies when appropriate.



- WSIS Forum is a global UN multistakeholder platform facilitating the implementation of the WSIS Action Lines for advancing sustainable development. The Forum is co-organized by the ITU, UNCTAD, UNDP, and UNESCO, in close collaboration with all WSIS Action Line co-facilitators and other UN organizations. It represents the largest annual gathering of the information and communication technologies (ICTs) community discussing the trends, evolution, and challenges of digital topics.
- The Forum provides an opportunity for information exchange, knowledge creation and sharing of best practices, while identifying emerging trends and fostering partnerships, taking into account the evolving information and knowledge societies. The WSIS Forum will therefore serves as a key forum for discussing the role of ICTs as a means of implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals and targets, with due regard to the global mechanism for follow-up and review of the implementation of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.
- The WSIS Forum, each year encourages the participation of all stakeholders, governments, private sector, civil society, technical community and the academia to showcase innovative ICTs technologies and policies that have brought about social change and more importantly economic empowerment.
- The ICTs and Gender Mainstreaming special track is dedicated to the issues of bridging gender divide, women empowerment and promoting equality perspective through the use of ICTs. The special track aims to engage multistakeholders through a holistic cross-sectoral intersectional approach.


### **WSIS Stocktaking Repository of Women in Technology**



#### **FIVE PHASES OF THE CONTEST**

- The first phase: Submission phase
   1 September 2021 21 January 2022 (Deadline for last submission: 23:00 Geneva time)
- The second phase: Nomination Phase. Revision of submitted projects that will result with a list of 360 nominated projects, twenty (20) projects per Action Line Category (18) 1 February 25 February 2022 (twenty projects per each category will be nominated)
- <u>The third phase</u>: Public online voting (identification of five projects per category with the highest number of votes)
  - 1 March 31 March 2022 (Deadline for casting last vote: 23:00 Geneva time)
- <u>The fourth phase</u>: Selection of winning projects by the ITU Expert Group that will result with a list of winning projects
  - 1 April 15 April 2022
