Mobile phones are stolen every single day and night. How safe is yours from the crooks?

- * Do you always keep it on you in a non-visible place?
- * Have you noted your mobile number, phone make and the IMEI number? (The IMEI number can be found behind the battery, or by typing in *#06# into the keypad).
- * Have you written your name onto the phone using an ultra violet pen, which the police can scan if it gets stolen and found or handed to a police station?
- * Have you set up the sim lock and phone lock features of your phone? This will protect your subscription and the personal information on your phone.

If the answers are yes's, well done, you are keeping those thieves at bay!

If your phone ever gets stolen, call your service provider immediately to bar all calls to and from your mobile. You can also call 08701 123123. You should also report the theft to the police. This is where your IMEI number will come in handy; it will help the police identify that the phone is yours if they find it.

Locked Out?

If your SIM card becomes "blocked" for e.g. after three unsuccessful attempts at entering your pin code, you will no longer be able to make or receive calls. If this happens, contact your network provider who will be able to help you unlock your phone.
