
## I. Understanding Spam





**Under the Korean legislation** 

"any commercial information sent via e-mail, telephone, facsimile, etc. against a recipient's expressed rejection"

#### Spam in Korea

#### ★ Number of Spam received per day

	2001	2002	'03. MAR	'03. NOV	'04. MAY
Total Spam	4.7	34.9	50.0	29.1	26.7
Illegal contents (%)	0.9 (19%)	21.3 (61%)	31.5 (63%)	8.4 (29%)	8.7 (33%)

#### ★ Cumulative economic damage by Spam



# The Act on Promotion of Information & Communication Network Utilization and Information Protection

Enactment/Amendment	Main Regulation				
February 1999	Opt-out				
January 2001	Opt-out + Labeling				
December 2002	Opt-out + Labeling				
	Expansion of media type to control spam				
	Strengthening protection of juveniles				
	Prohibition of technical manipulation				
	Prohibition of automatic generating and harvesting contacts				
	Strengthening ISPs and ESPs' rights against spammers				
December 2003	Stiffening penalties (raising fine for negligence)				
January 2005	Opt-in (except e-mail)				







#### Regulating illegal Spam

- Counseling on Spam and handling complaints reported from the public
- Investigating whether legal violation or not (based on the act)
- Requesting MIC or Public Prosecutors Office of legal punishment
