FOREWORD

3 Calling Line Identification Presentation (CLIP) and Calling Line Identification Restriction (CLIR)

3.1 Scope

This Recommendation defines the stage 2 of the integrated services digital network (ISDN) as provided by the telecommunications operators for the Calling Line Identification Presentation (CLIP) and Calling Line Identification Restriction (CLIR) supplementary services. Stage 2 identifies the functional capabilities and the information flows needed to support the service description. The stage 2 description also identifies user operations not directly associated with a call (see Recommendation I.130 [1]).

This Recommendation is defined according to the methodology specified in Recommendation Q.65 [2].

This Recommendation does not formally describe the relationship between these supplementary services and the basic call but, where possible, this information is included for guidance.

In addition, this Recommendation does not specify the requirements where the service is provided to the user via a private ISDN. This Recommendation does not specify the requirements for the allocation of defined functional entities within a private ISDN; it does however define which functional entities may be allocated to a private ISDN.

This Recommendation does not specify the additional requirements where the service is provided to the user via a telecommunications network that is not an ISDN.

The CLIP supplementary service provides the called party with the possibility to receive identification of the calling party.

The CLIR supplementary service enables the calling party to prevent presentation of its ISDN number to the called party.

The CLIP and CLIR supplementary services are applicable to all telecommunication services.

This Recommendation is applicable to the stage 3 Recommendations for the ISDN CLIP and CLIR supplementary services, as defined in Recommendation I.130 [1].

3.6 *Derivation of a functional model*

The functional entities required by the CLIP and CLIR supplementary services above those of the basic call are as follows:

FE1:caller provided information and CLIR requesting entity;

FE2:service information checking entity;

FE3:handling of calling line identity at international gateway;

FE4:service providing entity;

FE5:service requesting entity.

3.9 Functional entity actions (FEAs)

3.9.1 FEAs for FE1

- 910: FE1 shall receive and shall forward originating users service requests to FE2;
- 911: FE1 shall request the CLIR supplementary service temporary mode (override of network stored value of presentation indicator);
- 915: in the case of a special arrangement, FE1 shall screen the number to be provided;
- 916: in the case of a special arrangement, FE1 shall complete the number to national or international format (for ISDN-numbers);
- 917: FE1 shall set the type of number;
- 918: FE1 shall set the numbering plan identification.

3.9.2 FEAs of FE2

- 920: FE2 shall check if calling line identity is provided by FE1 and if not, shall include the default calling line identity with presentation indicator set to "network provided";
- 921: FE2 shall verify calling line identity (unless a special arrangement for not screening the number exists);
- 922: FE2 shall complete a partial number or a subscriber number to a national number. FE2 shall put the number into the format used in the current ISDN;
- 923: FE2 shall set the presentation indicator;
- 924: FE2 shall set the screening indicator;
- 925: FE2 shall set the type of number (when a special arrangement exists, FE1 shall also set the type of number);
- 926: FE2 shall set the numbering plan identification (when a special arrangement exists, FE1 shall also set the numbering plan identification);
- 927: FE2 shall forward the information to FE3.

3.9.3 FEAs of FE3

In the case of a national call, FE3 has null functionality.

- 930: FE3 shall check if a partial number, or no information, is received. In this case no information is sent to FE4;
- 931: FE3 shall check if the calling line identity may be passed between the networks;
- 932: FE3 shall convert national ISDN-number to an international significant ISDN number if not already in this form. Number belonging to other numbering plans shall be passed transparently;
- 933: if a number cannot be passed to FE4, FE3 shall erase the number and sub-address information and shall set the presentation indicator to "number not available";
- 934: FE3 shall forward the information to FE4.

3.9.4 FEAs for FE4

- 940: FE4 shall check if the CLIP supplementary service is subscribed;
- 941: FE4 shall check if calling line identity is provided. If the number is not available, then FE4 shall set the presentation indicator to "number not available";

- 942: FE4 shall check if presentation restrictions exist. If presentation restrictions exist, the number and sub-address information shall be erased, no number information shall be sent to the calling party and the received presentation indicator (PI) showing "presentation restricted" shall be sent to FE5 unless FE5 has the override category. If FE5 has such a category, then all the received information shall be sent to FE5;
- 943: FE4 shall transfer the received information into a format that makes it usable by FE5 (e.g. adding prefixes);
- 944: FE4 shall forward the information to FE5.

3.9.5 FEAs for FE5

- 950: FE5 shall receive the service information from FE4;
- 951: FE5 shall transfer the received information into a format that makes it usable for returning a call;
- 952: FE5 shall present the received information to the served user.
- 3.10 Allocation of functional entities to physical locations

The possible locations of functional entities FE1, FE2, FE3, FE4 and FE5 are shown in Table 3-5/Q.81.

ANNEX A

(to § 3 of Recommendation Q.81)

Two calling-line-identities delivery option

A.1 Scope

This annex specifies the additional procedures of the CLIP supplementary service that may be supported as a national network option.

These national procedures shall have no impact and shall place no requirements whatsoever on the provision and operation of the CLIP supplementary service defined in this Recommendation by public ISDNs that do not support these additional procedures, nor on the interchangeability of terminals.

A.2 Additional procedures of FE4

If the procedures for delivery of the calling line identity as described in § 3.8 (SDL diagram for FE4) apply and the screening indicator is set to "user provided not screened", then the FE4 shall send the second calling line identity immediately following the first calling line identity. The second calling line identity shall be the default calling line identity of the access of the calling party. The second calling line identity shall be provided according to procedures described in this Recommendation.

In all other cases, only the first calling line identity shall be sent.

5 Connected Line Identification, presentation and restriction (COLP and COLR)

5.1 Scope

This Recommendation defines the stage 2 of the integrated services digital network (ISDN) as provided by public telecommunications operators for the Connected Line Identification Presentation (COLP) and Connected Line Identification Restriction (COLR) supplementary services. The stage 2 description also identifies user operations not directly associated with a call (see Recommendation I.130 [1]).

This Recommendation is defined according to the methodology specified in Recommendation Q.65 [2].

This Recommendation does not formally describe the relation between these supplementary services and the basic call but, where possible, this information is included for guidance.

In addition, this Recommendation does not specify the requirements where the service is provided to the user via a private ISDN. This Recommendation does not specify the requirements for the allocation of defined functional entities within a private ISDN; it does however define which functional entities may be allocated to a private ISDN.

This Recommendation does not specify the additional requirements where the service is provided to the user via a telecommunications network that is not an ISDN.

The COLP supplementary service provides the calling party with the possibility to receive identification of the connected party.

The COLR supplementary service enables the connected party to prevent presentation of its ISDN number to the calling party.

The COLP and COLR supplementary services are applicable to all telecommunication services.

This Recommendation is applicable to the stage 3 standards for the ISDN COLP and COLR supplementary services. The term "stage 3" is defined in Recommendation I.130 [1].

 - 922: FE2 shall check if presentation restrictions exist. 5.11 Interactions with other supplementary services

The COLP supplementary service interacts with the freephone supplementary service in such a way that when the freephone supplementary service is used, the served user shall receive the freephone number as the connected line identification. The description of this is included in the stage 2 description of the freephone supplementary service (see Recommendation Q.86, Section 4 [10]).
