REPORT OF THE WORKING PARTY MEETING

1. General

The first meeting of WP XV/1 was held in Geneva on 8 and 9 July 1985 under the chairmanship of Mr. M. Yamashita (NTT, Japan).

2. Questions assigned to the WP

The following Questions have been assigned to WP XV/1 by the Study Group.

- Q1-5/XV
- Q14 and Q27/XV will be examined as necessary.

7.2 Discussions and agreements

7.2.1 Report of the activities of the Specialists Group on coding for visual telephony

The Chairman of the Specialists Group reported their activities covering the two meetings held in December 1984 and April 1985 according to Temporary Documents 12-14. These activities include study on both 1.5 Mbit/s primary rate codec and new generation sub-primary rate codec (see Annex 1).

For 1.5 Mbit/s primary rate codec specification, the Working Party approved modification of existing Part 2 of Recommendation H.120 as shown in Annex 2. It also approved in principle the insertion of Part 3 as contained in Annexes 3 and 4 into Recommendations H.120 and H.130, subject to satisfactory verification in hardware trials.

For new generation sub-primary rate codec, the progress report was approved encouraging further study.

Temporary Document 12 requested guidance of the Working Party on the two items. After some discussion, the following agreements were obtained.

1) Frame structure study

Working Party XV/1 recognized that the study on frame structure of codecs is definitely under its responsibility judging from Questions assigned to it. Contributions are invited to give guidance to the Specialists Group on requirements for frame structure of the new generation sub-primary rate codec.

2) Intellectual property related to CCITT standardization

The Specialists Group decided, when working on the 1.5 Mbit/s primary rate codec, to establish general guidelines as follows:

- a) All specifications should include sufficient details to allow the manufacture of compatible equipment with no intellectual property constraints, as far as compatibility is concerned.
- b) "No constraints" means at least "granting of non-exclusive licenses on fair and reasonable terms".
- c) This agreement does not constitute a precedent to the future work of this Specialists Group.

The Working Party reviewed the conclusion of the Specialists Group on this issue and found it a good working-level approach; even though the guidelines had not been considered a precedent, the Working Party encouraged the Group to adopt them for future work.
