Subject: Consultation by correspondence on the change of place and dates of the World Telecommunication Development Conference 2021 (WTDC-21)

Dear Madam/Sir,

On 21 January 2022, Member States of the ITU Council held an informal consultation to discuss the preparations for the upcoming WTDC, WTSA and Council.

After further discussion on the issues raised in the circular letter <u>DM-21/1025</u> dated 6 December 2021 from the Chairman of Council, the Councillors were in agreement that hosting the WTDC in Addis Ababa, Federal Democratic Republic of Ethiopia, was no longer a feasible option, and united in their wish to maintain the conference in Africa if possible. On the understanding that the fallback venue (in the absence of a new host) would be Geneva, the meeting sought proposals for an alternate venue from African Member States. Following this request for proposals, the Councillor from Rwanda informed the meeting of Rwanda's willingness to host the conference in Kigali, which received unanimous support from the meeting.

I am pleased to inform you that on 30 January 2022 the Secretary-General received an official invitation from the Government of Rwanda to hold the next WTDC in the city of Kigali from 6 to 16 June 2022, immediately preceded by the Youth Summit starting on 2 June 2022.

In accordance with No. 42 of the Convention, the Council shall determine the precise place and exact dates of a WTDC with the concurrence of a majority of the Member States. Any changes to these decisions are also subject to the same process.

Consequently, I hereby invite Member States of the ITU Council to inform the Secretary-General of their concurrence with the change of place and dates of WDTC-21 as described above using the **online tool**^{*} or using the template in <u>Annex 1</u> by e-mail to <u>memberstates@itu.int</u>, **not later than Tuesday 8 February 2022**. The agreement of the Council on the matter will then be subject to the concurrence of the majority of the Member States of ITU, as per No. 46 of the Convention. The secretariat remains at your disposal if needed.

Subject: Rwanda's Interest to host the World Telecommunication Development Conference (WTDC) 2022

Reference to the circular issued on 6th December 2021 updating ITU Council Member States on the World Telecommuncation Development Conference 2021 (WTDC-21), and the need to explore alternative options for a host country for the next WTDC 2021 given that Addis was no longer an option.

Reference is also made to subsesquent informal consultations held regarding the hosting of the WTDC 2022; in which councillors expressed the wish to maintain the conference in Africa. Through these consultations Rwanda expressed its willingness to host the WTDC 2022 in Kigali, starting from June 2nd to June 16th, 2022 as an alternative to Geneva.

Rwanda boasts world-class MICE (Meetings, Incentives, Conference, and Events/Exhibition) infrastructure and a diverse range of international and local hotel brands supported by an excellent doing business environment. The iconic Kigali Convention Centre is the proposed main venue for WTDC 2022. Kigali has hosted major global events including the African Union Summit, AU & EU Summit, World Economic Forum, and Transform Africa Summit among others. There are other state of the art venues that would be available for any additional engagements.

The country enjoys excellent air connectivity through the national carrier-Rwandair, which flies to almost 30 destinations in Africa and around the world.
