Today, almost half of the world's population remains unconnected. The digital divide, exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic continues to be a challenge particularly for LDCs, LLDCs and SIDS. What is the response of the global community to this challenge? How can multiple stakeholders work together to extend universal access to digital connectivity?
