


The Commission for the Rights of Persons with Disability (CRPD)

Established on 3rd
November 1987



The Commission for the Rights of Persons with Disability (CRPD)

- Set up at law in 2000 thanks to the Equal Opportunities (Persons with Disability) Act, Cap 413
- It kept evolving through both practice and legal changes




The Commission for the Rights of Persons with Disability (CRPD)

- Malta signed the UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities and the Optional Protocol in March 2007, which were ratified in October 2012
- Commission was appointed the Independent Mechanism of the CRPD and its role is to protect, promote and monitor the implementation of the Convention

Total New Cases Reported compared with Access and Services – 2000/18



Comparison of cases reported

| Cases reported 2000 – 2018 | Total | Percentage |
|----------------------------|-------|------------|
| Accessibility | 969 | 42% |
| Services | 583 | 58% |
| Total | 2,301 | 100% |

Of these, only **2** cases featured complaints about inaccessible audio visual services

Cases Reported

- Lack of subtitling on programmes provided by broadcasting company
 - Service provider is planning to procure subtitles together with the movies it provides in its programming schedule
- Lack of subtitling in current affairs programmes
 - Lack of sign language interpreters and the short shelf life of such programmes exacerbate the problem. Signing only provided for 18:00 news bulletin.

Reasons for lack of accessibility – Maltese perspective

- Usually all boils down to lack of resources
 - Lack of sign language interpreters, even though LSM is an official language
 - Cost of introducing subtitles and audio descriptions
 - Lack of economies of scale due to micro-market
 - Local productions running on a shoestring budget
- Only one production was ever offered with subtitling

Portrayal of disabled persons on the media

- Objects of pity or charity
 - Feature prominently in telethons
 - CRPD asked regularly to pass judgment on whether clips are acceptable
- Collaboration with Broadcasting Authority to lead to Enabling Environment on the Media
 - Held workshops with local producers
 - Produced a list of dos and don'ts regarding both portrayal and terminology
